# SHEMER 3D ART SHOW SLATED, 'GIANT' 3D SCULPTURE AND JEWELRY DEBUT

It's been in the works for a while, but Kevin's submission for **Shemer Art Center**'s 3D art show **"Materialize: 3D Printing & Rapid Prototyping"** came down to the wire. "Everything had to

come together like clockwork," Kevin says.



It all started with the acquisition of a 3D printer that could print sculptures larger than the usual 14 inches or so. Kevin contracted with Steve and Jacob Graber of **Cerberus 3D** to create the 8-foot-tall Gigante printer, which can print items as tall as 4-1/2 feet. Apparently no other 3D printer that large is currently available to "mere mortals," although there are even larger commercial versions available.

As happens with activities on the "bleeding edge," the printer took longer to create than originally expected, but it was in place and printing four days before the show submission deadline. Kevin picked his design Simple Planes for the print, which would be 3 feet tall. At an estimated 33 hours to print, that meant it would finish just in time for his photographer to shoot it for submission. "Everything fell into place," Kevin says.

The resulting sculpture (*left*), <u>Simple Planes With</u>

<u>Aquamarine Stripe</u>, became a one-of-a-kind print
when a mysterious line appeared about halfway up the
sculpture. "We think it may have been caused by

corrupted filament [which is used to create a 3D printed item]. It's a beautiful touch that makes this sculpture really special," Kevin explains.

This and two other sculptures, **SpiritHole Sunset** and **Holy Cannoli**, will also debut in this show, as will Kevin's **jewelry line**. He says, "We've had a lot of interest in the jewelry line, which is all created with 3D printing, too." The jewelry includes earrings and necklaces in silver, brass and colorful plastic.

The show opens **Thursday, October 16**, with a free opening reception from 7 - 9 p.m., and runs through Thursday, November 27.

Kevin will also be **speaking on Thursday, November 13** about his journey with 3D printing. "It surprised even me," he admits. There will be several other special events associated with this show as well - stay tuned!


# 'BLANK CANVAS' SHOW ENDS, SQUARE UP MOVES TO SURPRISE CITY HALL

With the show "Blank Canvas" coming to a close, the city of Surprise, Arizona, just couldn't let the sculpture Square Up go.

The sculpture is now displayed in the city hall of this growing municipality.

"It took five of us to lift it onto that plinth," Kevin says. "It was definitely worth it."

"I have always thought of Square Up



as an outside sculpture," says Kevin. "But it really looks fantastic in that contemporary setting."

Square Up will be on display at city hall through December. Surprise City Hall is at 16000 N. Civic Center Plaza on the west side of the Valley of the Sun. <u>Here's a map.</u>

## **NEW SALES AND COMMISSIONS UNDER WAY**

With <u>Celestial Symmetry</u> now installed, Kevin is working on two new commissions. "I enjoy the challenge of bringing together place, people and purpose when designing a site specific sculpture," he explains.

**Banked Bramble** (seen above in the opening photo, top right) is the largest spike sculpture



Kevin has created thus far. It will be placed in front of a window in the home of some Arkansas patrons. "They wanted to filter the view from a window while still allowing in light," says Kevin. The piece will be 7-1/2 feet tall and nearly 3-1/2 feet wide. "They want a lot of movement in the piece, which is an interesting challenge when working with such thin yet strong 'lines' as the spikes," he explains. The sculpture will have a linseed oil finish. See its current progress on its own page.

Also under way in the studio is a fountain for a Dallas, Texas couple. **Sweet Flow** (above left)

is a site-specific water feature in Kevin's "singing dishes" series. "People love the look and the sound of this design," Kevin says. <u>Watch its progress</u> on its page.

Kevin also sold **Fuego** to a couple that is building a new home in the Troon area of North Scottsdale. "After reviewing plans for their new home, Fuego was an obvious choice for them," says Kevin. "It will look fantastic in their entry."


## IN THE PRESS: FEATURES AND MENTIONS

In addition to his commissions **Banked Bramble** and **Sweet Flow** (see above left),

Kevin continues to work on **She** (left), a

sculpture he originally created in CAD and has

printed in various sizes and colors of filament on
his 3D printer. (See a transparent version of She
here.)

"I love working with the 3D printer," says Kevin, "but I'd miss metal if I didn't also have the ability to bend, shape and weld it." Shaping the metal in this version of She, in particular, has been a tremendous challenge.

Also on the workbench is a new sound sculpture. "People really love these sound pieces," he muses. "I understand entirely - so do I! And that's a great example of a piece that just isn't possible to print in plastic. Now if I can afford a 3D printer that works in metal someday .... Well, I can dream."



# **BLOG SHARES TRIALS, TRIBULATIONS OF 3D PRINTING**




